It's hard to believe that I'm actually sitting here typing out my third Annual President's report, but as they say time flies when you're having fun!

Firstly, to all of our Patrolling Members, Nippers and your very supportive families thank you once again for your commitment and dedication to our awesome little club. It is only through your efforts that we continue to punch well above our weight in all areas of Lifesaving and Surf Sports, which truly makes us the envy of so many other clubs throughout Queensland.

This past season like no other saw a number of our club members receive multiple personal accolades and acknowledgment at the highest levels of Surf Lifesaving. On the club front, and after many seasons of dedicated and distinguished service both Bill Twigger and Warick Redwood were awarded Life Membership, a very fitting honour for two "old Shire" boys who have given our club over thirty five years' service between them to our club.

Sunshine Beach then went on to receive an unprecedented five awards at the Branch Excellence in Lifesaving Dinner winning Volunteer of Year Warick Redwood, Lifesaver of the Year Scott Summers, Rookie Surf Sports Coach of the Year Jo Redwood, Athlete of the Year Nick Sloman, and the Best Surf Sports Club Aggregate Award. In addition to this, we also achieved our highest ever placing with a very honourable fourth place in the prestigious Buhk-Wilkes Trophy.

At the SLSQ Excellence Awards, Warick again claimed the Volunteer of the Year Award, with Jo named Rookie Surf Sports Coach of the Year, and Scott awarded the Clive Hammond Silver Medal Award for Excellence in Lifesaving. But as we all know, the best was yet to come with Warick awarded the National Honour of SLSA's Volunteer of the Year. This award is a magnificent personal achievement and a fitting recognition for one of the hardest working volunteers this club or the lifesaving movement has ever seen. Well Done and Congratulations Warick!

There's no doubt that the success of any club is due in large part to its dedicated volunteers, along with very hardworking "front office", and I am very lucky to work beside an outstanding and tireless Board of Directors.

To our Board consisting of Deputy President Peter Brewer, Director of Administration Jane Fraser, Director of Finance Lisa Worthington, Director of Lifesaving Scott Summers, Director of Training and

Additionally, Dave Gleeson has now assumed the Sponsorship Coordinator portfolio and we look forward to seeing Dave's hard work deliver us some exciting new sponsors and financial support into the coming seasons.

The Supporters Club Committee of President Warick Redwood, Treasurer Peter Brewer, Secretary Jane Peeters and Active on Committee Kim Grove again supported the Lifesaving Club with its sound financial management and advice, along with our award winning Club Manager Tim Johnson, Chef Darren Sandilands and their dedicated staff whose outstanding work resulted in our club being awarded the 2016 Clubs Queensland "Small Club of the Year" for the third year in a row.

On the Lifesaving front, Directors Scott Summers, Paul Brady and Natalie McMaster have overseen Sunshine Beach reach new heights with 179 Active Members now patrolling our beach. My thanks to all our Patrol Captains and Active Members for maintaining the vigilance to ensure zero preventable deaths between the flags once again.

This growth in active patrolling members, increased awards and training qualifications will put our club in tremendous shape for many seasons to come, and I thank all our Trainers and Assessors for your commitment to this most important area of Lifesaving.

Our Surf Sports competitors both junior and senior enjoyed yet another brilliant season with a number of outstanding individual and team performances. The club captured numerous Branch, State and National Medals, along with having some eleven members

selected in the Sunshine Coast Inter Branch Team, and one in the Qld Cyclones Team. Our Annual Awards night saw a number of athletes recognised for their achievements, with special mentions to The “Sean Harrington” Competitor of the Year Jonty Redwood who was outstanding across the Pool, Surf Rescue and water events, while the Outstanding Achievement Award winner Talisa Brady claimed a National Gold Medal at the Aussies in the Champion Lifesaver. I would like to acknowledge Director of Surf Sports Dan Moore for his efforts during his first season in the role, Team Managers Gabrielle Collins, Peter Nolan and Pauline Gleeson, and our outstanding coaching team of Max Pettigrove, Clint Robinson, Alex Austin, Jo Redwood, Pauline Gleeson and Gerard Crow who’ve all been instrumental in developing our Surf Sports program into one of the best in the business.

One of the real success stories this season has certainly been the growth of our Youth and Cadet section under Director Warick Redwood. An increase from 40 to 68 members is testament to the hard work and dedication of Warick in an area that often struggles to both retain and recruit younger members as they come to the end of their Nipper years. Warick’s passion and commitment in trying to foster our youth and cadet program is clearly paying dividends for the club.

Our Junior Activities section under Director Dave Gleeson and his very dedicated Committee once again ensured the success of our Nipper program as one of the best in QLD. As a Nipper parent myself it’s great to see the very hardworking team of age managers, water safety and parent helpers along with so many families enjoying everything that this tremendous program has to offer from “Club Sundays to Surf Sports”, whilst safeguarding the future of our fantastic Nipper Program.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank all our club’s Sponsors who continue to support and assist us in our endeavours to deliver a quality lifesaving service to both the local and tourist visitors to our beach. My personal thanks also to SLSQ – Sunshine Coast for its continued support, in particular Branch President John Thorpe, Administrator Tanya Duncan and their respective committee and staff for their ongoing assistance also throughout the season.

And remember always... UNITY IS STRENGTH!!!



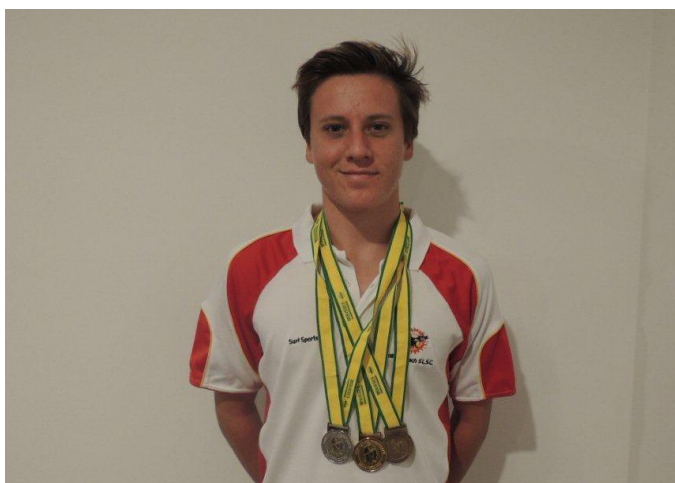

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE – Lisa Worthington

2015/6 season has been another successful year for all facets of Sunshine Beach Surf Life Saving Club. I am very pleased to be able to present the financials that are enclosed in this Annual Report for the year ended 30th April 2016. Our financial position has continued to strengthen while we deliver an excellent service to beachgoers and strong programs throughout our club for members.

The enviable result is a team effort overseen by our Board of Directors and our Supporters Club Committee, but implemented and managed by a great group of employees under the strong guidance of Tim Johnson. However it is important at this point that I recognise all members of the club, both Active and Supporters, who contribute both financially and with numerous volunteer hours to ensuring that we live up to our reputation of the “best little surf club on the coast”. My view may be biased but certainly the Supporters Club have for the third year running claimed Best Surf Lifesaving Supporter Club (small) in QLD and as you will read in other Director’s reports the performance of our patrolling members and our surf sports competitors has again been sensational.

We continue to be debt free while we have again invested in new equipment and, as most of you would be aware, undertaken a significant upgrade of our actives bathrooms and meeting/recreation area. The Supporters Club as our largest sponsor has again been instrumental in funding our activities. Our sponsorship of course runs beyond the Supporters Club and we are pleased that many local businesses return each year as sponsors of the important services that we provide to the community.

The budget discipline from all departments has continued throughout the year and certainly has assisted me in my role. To the Nippers, Surf Sports, Youth and Cadet and Lifesaving well done in meeting all your fundraising commitments and working hard to manage spending throughout the season.

Financial highlights for the 2016 year:

- Net Profit for the Supporters Club before donations to the Surf Club increased by almost 20% from \$750K in 2015 to \$897k
- Funding of improvements to the actives bathrooms and recreation areas through Grant Income and cash flow provided by Supporters Club whilst remaining debt free.

- Total net cost of funding Surf Club core activities including administration and surf lifesaving operations (i.e. the beach) \$160k (including purchase of new equipment).
- Net investment in our future lifesavers (Nipper & Cadets) \$20k (including purchase of new craft and equipment).
- Net cost of Surf Sports activities \$60k (including purchase of new craft).

Grants continue to underpin our equipment renewal programs and have assisted us in ensuring our lifesavers are trained on the latest equipment and have access to reliable and safe equipment in the event of a rescue. Listed below are the grants received for 2015/16 season:

- Annual Department of Emergency Services Grant \$24K
- Queensland Government Department of Community Safety/Surf Life Saving Queensland Sustainability and Extension of Services Grant of \$10.5K (IRB motors and radios)
- Australian Government Beach Safety Equipment Fund \$5K (New rescue boards)
- SLSQ Volunteer dividend \$5K

Along with these grants we have been very fortunate in receiving two bequests throughout the year from past supporters and these have been utilized in our fit out of the new active areas.

To all the Board, members and staff thank you and well done on another great year. Personally a special mention to Peter Brewer, who has provided me with constant advice and support in my role, as well as providing the all-important cash flow from Supporters Club as required.

I have enjoyed my two years as Director of Finance and look forward to watching the Club strengthen even further during the coming years.



DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION – Jane Fraser

Our 'little' Club is going strong, with 505 members including 179 patrol members.

It is interesting to note a 50/50 split between males and females throughout our Nipper, Cadet and young Active ranks, which bodes well for a good mix in the patrol ranks in the years ahead.

The Club has also been working on a new website and that is now live, giving us a renewed online presence for all aspects of the Club.

This year saw the introduction of a fob system for accessing the Actives area and gym and after some early teething problems that is now working well. You may find your fob will need to be reprogrammed when the season rolls over but after that they will be programmed for five years and will only be deactivated if your membership is not paid.

A big thank you to our administrator Terri Atkin for her patience during the introduction of this system and for keeping everything running so smoothly again this year. There is a large amount of documentation and communication to stay on top of and nothing is ever missed, which makes everyone's job easier.

As I am stepping down from this role, I want to take the opportunity to recognise the direction and commitment of the Club's Board. Few people see the time, passion and personal sacrifices that are made in these volunteer jobs and I am confident that the Club is in great hands.

I would also like to thank Andrew, Fergus and Hugh for their patience with the amount of time I've spent on surf lifesaving this year. It's been a big year, but a very productive one.

The 2015/2016 Season has been busy, but fortunately uneventful with regard to accidents or major incidents on our stretch of beach. Patrolling hours for our Active members were down on average when compared to last season and I put this down to the influx of new Active members we have gained these last 12 months. Our club is now enjoying its highest level of Active Members in its history and we continue to impress with our patrol standards and growth so well done to all for your continued professional approach to patrolling.

The Board of Directors has worked hard this season to ensure the club is financially sound and yet still be proactive with improving our facilities and services. The new Actives area is a great addition to our club providing a clean and modern space for training, meetings and functions as well as for just chilling out. Treat it well and it will continue to serve us for years to come.

This year my personal work commitments increased substantially and subsequently, some aspects of gear and equipment management had to wait a little longer than usual and I am grateful to Andrew Fraser who was able to manage a number of these concerns. Andrew has been a great help this season having taken on the role of ATV Officer, thank you Andrew for your problem solving and initiative.

It is clear that most of our membership base draws from our junior club, or rather, the parents of our junior members and our family friendly approach and orientation certainly helps to achieve this. Being inclusive and supportive of our junior program is an important part of our Actives membership. A Nipper of today could be tomorrow's Patrol Captain or IRB driver/crew so finding solutions to support the carnival commitments and training requirements of our junior members remains a patrol roster priority. In addition, facilitating the training of our youth members so they can step between the red and yellows as best prepared as they can be is also a priority, as well as finding ways to keep them engaged on patrol. Our young members are a great asset on the beach and their return each season and their gain of further skills and attributes is a key contributor in keeping our beach a safe place for the bathing public.

Next season I am looking to create a 12th Patrol though it is proving more difficult than it seems. Having an additional patrol will mean volunteer hours will be further reduced and lighten the load for all our patrol

Training will continue and courses will be available in the "off season" and I encourage everyone to seek out new members and urge your friends to join our great club.

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DIRECTOR OF TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT – Natalie McMaster

Sunshine Beach Surf Life Saving Club is committed to providing our Patrol members with training and assessments that are held at our own club as much as possible with the view that our members must be alert to the conditions and issues that may arise on our beach whilst on patrol.

With few qualified trainers available this has not always been achievable however we have pursued and now maintain a positive working relationship with the Chief Training Officer at Noosa Heads Surf Club and on occasion have facilitated joint courses that have benefited members of both Clubs. Noosa members have joined courses that we have run at Sunshine and some of our members have participated in courses at Noosa. When our members have been involved we ensured that some training occurred at our beach.

This season we saw 68 qualifications gained by females in the surf club and 92 awards gained by males. 6 courses were run at Sunshine Beach resulting in 59 qualifications originating from the club. In addition we ran 5 Skills Maintenance sessions and a couple of last

minute assessments to ensure proficiency of all our patrolling members by the due date of December 31. We also put through 109 Surf Education awards for our Nippers and 125 Nipper surf competencies which in no small part are thanks to our Nipper Age Managers.

Many thanks to all our trainers and assessors who have given their time voluntarily, over and above their patrol commitments, to ensure that all necessary training and assessment requirements were met so that our patrols remain at a high standard. I'd also like to acknowledge my predecessor Paul Brady for his work to keep the training wheels turning particularly in regard to developing a good rapport with the Noosa CTO that has helped ease my progress into the training and development role.

Planning for the coming season is well on track with several courses mapped out and 5 Skills Maintenance sessions already added to our Club Calendar. We also have a strong training team in place and with expressions of interest in courses looking healthy already I look forward to a successful 2016/17 season.

ACTIVE MEMBER REPRESENTATIVE – Natalie McMaster

The Active Member Representative is the voice of the Active patrolling members and as such there were many agenda items included in Management Committee meetings at the request of members. Items that were initiated include:

- Winter and Summer activity programs – Noosa Box Office reduced fee session, cardio/strength training session, ski, board and subsidised swim squad sessions twice a week
- Purchase of fitness equipment – equipment was purchased for active cardio/strength training sessions
- Surfing group – David Gleeson agreed to coordinate this in the off season and monthly surfing sessions have been scheduled
- Coffee machine in Active's room – coffee machine is still in place with \$1 cost per coffee
- Online patrol member substitutes – Branch was notified of the need to be able to identify the qualifications required when asking and accepting patrol subs in the online system
- Notification if food unavailable for patrol – Note has been made to provide prior notification to patrol members should food be unavailable from the Club due to Public holidays closures

Another important aspect of this role is patrol food and member benefits post patrol. These were continued from last season and included muffins and juice on morning patrols, hot chips and party pies for afternoon patrols. During Easter Hot Cross Buns were provided instead of the usual patrol food. Post patrol discount food entitlement and post patrol drink could be redeemed on the weekend of patrol, not just the day of patrol. Discounted coffees were also available from the Club restaurant.

Opportunities for Active Patrolling members to get together were organised and well attended this season. Activities included:

- Season Starter afternoon – in the Actives area attended by 100 members
- Christmas Party – on the deck attended by 50 members and sponsors
- Pudding Hunt – on the beach attended by 40 families

It has also been wonderful this season to see the start of a Masters team for the club, which supports Active Patrolling members to improve on their surf lifesaving skills and compete for the club.

DIRECTOR OF YOUTH & CADET – Warick Redwood

Our Youth members are the future of our club and its ongoing successes in both patrolling; keeping Sunshine Beach a safe environment to swim, surf and enjoy; and in surf sports where we have a truly enviable reputation across all aspects of traditional beach and surf events, Pool Rescue, Patrol Competition and Champion Lifesaver.

The main focus of our youth section is to foster social interaction between our members to enjoy different activities and friendships outside of beach duties. Hopefully those who have chosen to get involved in our events have relished in the different activities and had a cracking good time while doing it, gathered some great memories and had a laugh or two. All of these things aim to keep our young lifesavers interested and keen to hit the beach and do their community a service for many years.

To this end, our end of season trip in July last year certainly hit the heights and provided 30 of us with a unique experience and plenty of good memories. Certainly, gaining our PADI dive accreditation and living on a boat in the Great Barrier Reef was a highlight for all. Our pre-season trip to Borumba Dam water skiing and going 'really fast' on jet skis was awesome fun with heaps of food and drink and a big start to the season. Huge thanks to the families that provided transport and of course the water craft to make it happen!

Over what seemed a more hectic season than ever before, we did manage a couple of Friday evening dinner, movie and ice cream nights at the club, which apart from the movie choice, were well attended and enjoyable. The 'treasure hunt' on the beach by torchlight proved that some of the kids have great surf skills but are useless at following treasure maps! Luckily none of them are pirates! Or maybe it was the 'map' that was a bit askew?

Some members took advantage of an offer from Sunreef Dive through Sunshine Coast Branch and completed an Advanced Dive course on the HMAS Brisbane, and about 18 more are preparing to do the same or the basic course in the next month or so. This is a great opportunity and lifelong skill they can all learn.

As has been my mantra for many years, and no differently with youth activities, if you choose to get involved, there is much to be gained. As youth mentors we need to keep putting great stuff out there for anyone who wants to join in and make it memorable and fun. Our young members already have an outstanding commitment to Patrol our beach, offering worthwhile social events is providing experiences that add positively to their whole surf lifesaving journey.

It has been my absolute pleasure leading, guiding and watching our youth members over the last number of years and I look forward to offering any advice or mentoring in the future to any of our Sunshine Beach family of youth members. They really are an awesome bunch of kids.



DIRECTOR OF JUNIOR ACTIVITIES – David Gleeson

What a terrific season we've just had at Sunshine Beach Nippers. With enrolment this season of 158 Nippers (22 of whom have now moved up into Cadets) we were down slightly on previous years due to our more stringent water safety requirements and not offering an Under 6 age group this year. However what we lacked in numbers we made up for with great attitude and the vast majority of nippers were more than competent and willing to have a crack even in big surf/rough conditions, which was great to see and bodes well for future.

As this was my second year in the JAC Chairman position I wasn't quite as stressed and confused as last year! Of course there was still a lot of behind the scenes work which had to be done but with great assistance from an awesome bunch of parents, committee and age managers we managed to get it done.

I'd firstly like to thank all committee and those in senior volunteer roles that assisted through the year. Being on committee involves lots of time behind the scenes which nobody ever really understands until you've done it so a massive thanks to all who turn up for regular meetings and put forward new ideas and energy. Despite everyone chipping in there are always those who do far more than is asked of them, so I'd like to make mention of those who turned up every week to help with set up, BBQ, carnivals etc. You all know who you are.

This year we had the age group volunteer weekly set up roster which again seemed to work pretty well and also ensures that parents feel like they are part of the program and involved. From beach set up to BBQ to pack up the process works well and ensures that we all share the load.

Highlights of the year were the Family Fun Day, Hell Week and Hell Day, 10 Grand in the Hand, Santa's visit, Christmas Day Lolly Hunt and all the carnivals throughout the year, culminating in Branch and State Titles and even Australian titles for the U14's. It was pleasing to say that Sunshine again punched well above our weight at carnivals with a 5th place at State and many medals at Aussies, 'that little club' Sunshine Beach was regularly heard over the microphone at all these carnivals.

We also ran a '2 way' mini carnival with Noosa which unfortunately was cut short by a lightning storm but showed real promise for the future and was a hit with both parents and kids of both clubs. I hope these programs can continue in future years, again it all comes down to volunteers putting their hands up and making it happen.

We upgraded some of our nipper gear inventory with 12 new foamy club Sunday boards and a new 6x3 metre tent from sponsors Otto and Partners. We will continue to upgrade our gear and equipment in future as resources allow.

Moving forward I am stepping down from the JAC Chairman role and at time of writing a replacement for the position has not been confirmed. However I look forward to some new faces and ideas on committee and hope that whoever takes the reins next year continues to build on the good program and great 'vibe' that has been built up over the last several seasons at Sunshine Beach Nippers. Thanks for all the kind words and encouragement during my time as JAC Chairman and I'm looking forward to continuing to support the nippers in other ways in coming years.

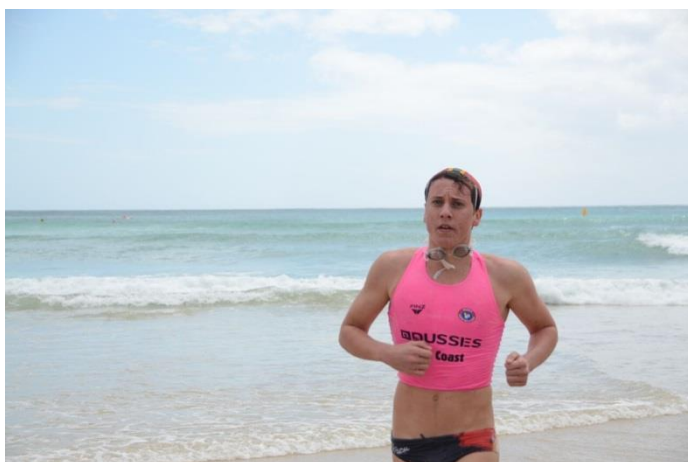

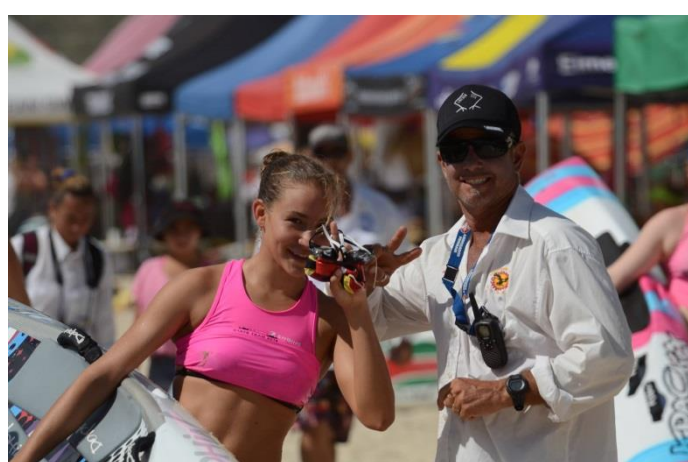

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2016

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity. The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

- (a) **Income Tax**
The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-40 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- (b) **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**
Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.
- (c) **Impairment of Assets**
At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.
- (d) **Employee Provisions**
Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.
- (e) **Provisions**
Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.
- (f) **Cash on Hand**
Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.
- (g) **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**
Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.
- (h) **Revenue and Other Income**
Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.
- Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.
- Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.
- If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidentally to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST recoverable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(k) Financial Assets

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

(l) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

SUPPORTERS CLUB COMMITTEE REPORT

The Sunshine Beach Surf Life Saving Supporters Club enjoyed a year of substantial sales growth and outstanding profitability, continuing to deliver quality food and beverages of choice with excellent customer service.

The Club was extremely proud to be recognised for the third successive year for its excellence across a broad range of KPI's in the Clubs Queensland Awards where Sunshine Beach was awarded 'Best Surf Life Saving Supporters Club (small)' which now grants it entry into the Awards "Hall of Fame". In making the Hall of Fame, the club becomes only the second Surf Club to do so which should make our members rightly proud.

Maintaining our aging building and infrastructure can at times be a challenge but through preventative maintenance programs and diligent oversight we still believe that we present the best possible presentation given the resources at our disposal.

Bar Sales in 2015-16 rose more steeply than at any time in the past decade – 12.3% - and the club exceeded \$2 million (ex gst) in sales for the first time in the club's history (up from \$1.787 LY)

Restaurant sales rose by a very impressive 17.1%. The Management committee in reflecting on our restaurant would like to again thank Darren and his team for another year of excellence in preparing and presenting large volumes of meals for eager members and guests.

Whilst limited to 15 machines in a confined space, our Gaming machine net return again increased by a substantial 11.6%, while membership income increased by 11.2% and function net income up by a significant 41.6%.

Total net income exceeded \$3 million (ex gst) for the first time, enjoying a 14.4% rise on 2014/15 and most pleasingly through management oversight we saw total expenditure well controlled against the sales increases.

This led to an operating profit before depreciation of \$974,147, up \$144,378 on last year (last year \$829,769) which is an excellent result indeed.

Throughout the year our building requires ongoing maintenance and repairs to present well to members and guests. All members would confirm that our infrastructure is 'tired' and there appears a collective

goodwill to invest wisely in upgrading the facility to ensure we remain a viable business going forward. We look forward to concrete steps being taken to this end in the imminent future.

Having identified some softening in our market share in functions/weddings some fifteen months ago, our investment in electronic media and social media advertising has seen us return to a strong booking sheet with solid forward bookings through 2016-17. There is much competition in this space on the coast and our staff do a wonderful job in ensuring that wedding parties and guests leave our venue with high satisfaction levels which in turn drives recommendations to continue to further enhance this important aspect of our business.

The Supporters Club is very fortunate to have a stable and long serving Management Committee and we are indebted to President Warick Redwood, Vice President Craig Law, Secretary Jane Peeters, Treasurer Peter Brewer and Committee Member Kim Grove for their efforts and our outstanding financial results.

The club also passes on our thanks to Club Manager Tim Johnson, Functions Manager Deb Court, Operations Manager Craig Spencer and all our staff for their support of our ongoing quest for a customer first culture second to none and playing their role in making our club a great place to enjoy gaming, a drink or a meal.

The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity. The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The income tax expense (income) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income). The club does not apply deferred income tax expense (income).

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt. If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(k) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
